Spring Tree Care and Maintenance

We gleefully enjoy seeing the little buds pop up on the trees and shoots of green coming up from the ground. Those are signs that spring is finally here and hopefully winter is behind us.

What is essential to do this time of year is inspect all your trees for any signs of winter's damage. Damage can be caused from the freezing temperatures winter is known for and Ohio's winter 2017/2018 is no exception. Branches can be frostbitten, and bark/trunk could be starting to split. It's very important for a tree's maintenance to have branches trimmed and trunks repaired that are showing signs of stress.

Our Certified Arborists are trained and well educated on the needs of trees. Pruning can cause stress to a tree, and having an expert take on the task will ensure the proper amount to remove. Trees that are properly pruned live longer, create a safer environment and enhance your property's appearance. We understand that every tree and landscape is unique, which is why we offer a full range of tree services to keep your trees and landscape healthy and vibrant all-year-round.

We consider all the possibilities of saving a tree from removal, but sometimes poor conditions, bad location and other criteria will factor in, and it's best to have it removed for many reasons to avoid risk. We do inspect carefully to see if there is any way we can prevent any tree removal. We also include stump removal with a cutting machine that grounds the stump into wood chips. Stump chips are left on site because they serve as excellent mulch but we will gladly remove the wood chips if you prefer.

Insect control

We manage pests including the Emerald Ash Borer and all types of destructive insects which can devalue your property. Countless insects live on, in, and around trees - many are harmless, while others can cause fatal damage.

Chewing Insects - Defoliating insects migrate to the foliage of a tree and feed on the leaves. Other chewing insects attack the fruit. Caterpillars and beetles make up the largest proportion of chewing insects. Generally, trees can bounce back from an attack of these defoliators, though repeat infestation will weaken a tree and can eventually kill it by starving it of energy.

Boring Insects - Boring insects are often the most harmful to trees and if left untreated can cause death. Boring, or tunneling, insects cause damage by boring into the stem, roots, or twigs of a tree. Some lay eggs which then hatch and the larvae burrow more deeply into the wood blocking off the water-conducting tissues of the tree. Signs of borer infestation include entry/exit holes

in the bark, small mounds of sawdust at the base, and sections of the crown wilting and dying. It is important to regularly monitor a tree's trunk for signs of boring insects to enable early identification and quick treatment.

Sucking Insects - These insects do their damage by sucking out the liquid from leaves and twigs. Many sucking insects (e.g. scale insects) are relatively immobile, living on the outside of a branch and forming a hard protective outer coating while they feed on the plant juices in the twig. Quite often they will excrete a sweet, sticky substance known as honeydew which contains unprocessed plant material. Honeydew can cause sooty mold to form on leaves and can become a nuisance for



homeowners. Signs of infestation include scaly formations on branches, dieback of leaves, and honeydew production.

Healthier trees are less likely to become infested, so maintaining the strength and vitality of your tree is an important prevention step. Once insects are present, controlling movement up and down the stem with physical barriers can interrupt the lifecycles of many harmful pests. Tree Fertilization



The main reason to fertilize trees and shrubs is to bolster their health so they are better prepared to fight off pests, disease, and environmental stresses. While fertilizer can't solve all of a tree's problems, it will go a long way to give it a fighting chance.

DOES MY TREE NEED FERTILIZER?

Trees growing in their natural habitat should have access to all of the minerals they need to survive and grow. Anything you can do to mimic that habitat can reduce the need for fertilizer. This may include letting leaves remain on the ground in the fall instead

of raking them up. Chances are, though, that despite your best efforts, the need for fertilizer will not be entirely eliminated.

WHEN SHOULD I HAVE MY TREE FERTILIZED?

A good time to fertilize trees in most Northern temperate climates is from fall to mid-spring. At these times the tree's roots take the nutrients from the soil and apply them to important health-promoting functions such as root development and disease resistance, rather than simply putting out new growth.

During the growing season, fertilizing can help a tree overcome mineral deficiencies and fight off infections. Our formulation will give trees the strength and vitality they need to stay healthy. Some of the nutrients will have a chance to be absorbed by the roots and will already be in the ground when the roots resume functioning in the spring.
